## From the Pastor

"Lord, if Your resurrection began a new calendar and if You have such power over time, then I will see time as Your gift to me, and that You came to save me from being either enemy or slave of time." (Herbert Brokering, Lord If, 1977)

I find myself fascinated at the ways in which we mark time in our world. There are the days of the week. As a Christian I certainly see the necessity of keeping one day of rest and worship—for Lutheran Christians this Sabbath is Sunday because this is the day Christ rose from the dead. I have a totally different feel for specific times during the week, such as Friday or Saturday evenings (time to be with family), Sunday noon (time to check out sports), and even Monday morning (time to get back to work). There are the seasons of the year. I certainly have a different feel about the beginning of spring (new life) than about the beginning of winter (dormancy where life has trouble growing). When I think about summer or fall it is my sense of smell which dominates. I can smell the charcoal grills and suntan lotion, the baked apples and burning leaves.

Then there is the division of time according to years in our world. As we are entering a new year, 2018, there is for me a freshness and possibility. Even though I know it is an artificial division of time, perhaps this year I can "turn over a new leaf." Maybe this will be the year when I write my first book or run my first marathon. Maybe this year will be an epic year for my wife, children and spouses, and grandchildren. I have a sense of renewed optimism for all things as I turn over the calendar into a new year.

Why am I filled with optimism? It is a matter of seeing time like my mentor, Herb Brokering, does in his musing book of "if then" poems. It is a matter of seeing time as a "gift," of believing that our time here in this world is grace, and the same supplier of our time here is promising to supply us with an eternity of time (a kind of oxymoron). And because God is about relationship and not about how much we have done, this promise is free. I don't have to look at 2018 as the year to finally finish my "to do" list ("That will be the day"). Rather, I can see this new year as an open book where I can write a new chapter of my life in relationship to God, my family, my friends, and with myself.

I have found this distinction between life measured as "being" and not as "doing" to be a healthier, and certainly more Christian, way of approaching time. That does not mean I don't struggle with each day being measured by what I have "accomplished." We are all part of a world that constantly asks "how much" and "how many." But my baptism frees me up to see each day as "living as a child of God" who tries to get some stuff done

while knowing at the end of the day I will still be the same "beloved of God" I was at the beginning. I am a spouse, parent, and grandparent and I find my main value in those relationships as well. It is really a part of a Christian vocation that we all share. It is really about seeing ourselves as partners in a ministry of God to which we have all answered God's call by virtue of God's blessing calling forth our faith.

As Hope Lutheran Church enters a new year I am optimistic as well. There are many "to dos" on the lists of members and leaders of Hope. Foremost among those are the securing of a new pastoral leader. This is important work for the mission of this church, and certainly we need to uphold the work of the call committee with individual daily prayer and congregational weekly prayer. At the same time, 2018 will be measured by the relationships within the body of Christ at Hope, as well as the individual ministries of the baptized at Hope. It will be Hope's "mutual ministry" that will be all important at the end of the year. Just as we heard in November when we read Matthew 25:31-46, we can very well ask ourselves at the close of 2018: "How have we ministered to the least of our brothers and sisters? How have we cared for one another on a daily basis?" If we have served and cared for one another, if we have expanded that serving and caring to those who need our ministry anywhere, we have done it to Christ.

Don't get me wrong—setting goals and accomplishing goals are important to how we measure our lives. But our goals need to include people and growing relationships and celebrating life. They ultimately ought to be experienced as each season is—with our senses. Each day we have the unique opportunity to "stop and smell the roses" of that day, to see the goodness of life, to listen to the geese flying north or south, to feel the hand of another person, and to taste the sweetness of each day we live here, ultimately knowing God has much more in store for us.

In the musical <u>Rent</u>, as friends are dying from month to month (in the early days of AIDS), they sing:

"Five hundred twenty five thousand six hundred minutes.

Five hundred twenty five thousand moments so dear.

How do you measure,

Measure a year?

In daylights?

m dayngms.

In sunsets?

In midnights?

In cups of coffee?

In inches, in miles, in laughter, in strife?

In five hundred twenty five thousand six hundred minutes.

How do you measure a year in a life?

How about love?"

Not bad...not bad at all... if you mean God's love each day for us and our love extended to one another. May your year 2018 include lots of loving and caring and serving. And as this year unfolds at Hope may you work together with your new regular pastor at the ministry to which the people of Hope are called.

#### January Mission - Kids Against Hunger

Sunday School offerings in January will go to Kids Against Hunger. Kids Against Hunger is a joint project of the Beloit, Janesville and Edgerton Rotary Clubs, KAH-RCR, Inc. that brings volunteers together to package highly nutritious chicken flavored rice casseroles which are distributed locally, nationally and internationally to help prevent hunger and starvation. The packaging process involves manually combining rice, dehydrated soy, dehydrated vegetables and a vitamin fortified chicken flavored powder and then weighing and sealing each bag.

#### ELCA SOUTH-CENTRAL SYNOD OF WISCONSIN

One of the goals of the interim period is to work on our relationship to the synod. It is a great time for that because of the ongoing work in the call process with the synod leadership. At Hope we have had the primary assistance from Pastor Steve Kottke, the Assistant to the Bishop. We are thankful for the work of the synod in Hope's behalf.

There has been a recent development in the synod office, which is leading to Bishop Mary Froiland's choice to leave her office one year short of her six-year term as bishop. She announced it in the following letter, which was dated October 11, 2017.

Dear Partners in Ministry in the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin,

I am writing to inform you that I will be ending my service as the bishop of our synod next June, a year earlier than my full term.

As most of you know, on May 12, 2017, I suffered a heart attack. I was treated quickly with a coronary stent, and have received good medical care, effective medication and successfully completed cardiac rehab. What most of you do not know is at the same time I was diagnosed with thyroid cancer. The type of cancer I have is not aggressive, is contained, and easily treatable by removing the thyroid. The problem is that since I am on blood thinners for the coronary stent, I am unable to have my thyroid removed at this time. My doctors are monitoring the situation and everything is stable. They are not concerned. This really is not a big deal compared to what so many live with. I am doing well and feeling more fit and healthy than I have in years.

Nonetheless, these health scares have caused John and me to think about what is of ultimate importance in our lives and make decisions about how best to live fully and faithfully into the future. We have decided that it is time for us to move closer to home and family – including my parents and our grandchildren. To that end, we will be seeking our next calls in the Twin Cities.

This means our synod will be electing a new bishop at our next synod assembly, May 5-6, 2018. The synod council will be reviewing the Bishop's election process and assembling election and transition teams. More information will be shared with you as details are worked out.

This also means it is time for each of you to begin to identify potential candidates for the Office of Bishop. Talk with each other, ask questions, seek out gifted pastors, and pray. I will always be available to answer questions about the role and responsibilities of a bishop, but I cannot and will not bring opinions about who should serve in that role.

Serving as your bishop has been one of the greatest honors and privileges of my ministry and I thank you for your call and trust. I have been blessed to share times of celebration and struggle with so many of you. I will miss gathering with you at synod events and in your congregations on Sunday mornings. You have touched my heart, fed my spirit, and given me hope as you live out your faith in Jesus. John joins me in expressing deep gratitude for your welcome, friendship, support and partnership in this good gospel work.

God's peace as we continue walking together in faith, Bishop Mary Froiland
